From the Party Leader

The last couple of months have been extremely busy for the Party in two ways. Firstly, we have expanded our number of active branches, and secondly, we had our inaugural National Meeting and Conference in Leeds on September 6th.

After a year of activity, it was the right time to set a date to get all of our Branches and some of their leading figures and representatives together in one place, where they could collectively address members and supporters of the Party, and network with each other offline. There is no substitute for real world organisation and commitment, and thus it was the next logical step for the Party.

I am pleased to say that, in the end, 55 people came, including some who travelled considerable distance (one visitor came from overseas), for this first true National Meeting.

What is a source of pride for myself and the Party is the fact that all of the support we cultivate is genuine. It is not a Party for chancers, baseless subversives, grifters, or hypocrites. Instead, those who join our Party and follow our Agenda do so because they genuinely believe in it. This shows every time our Branches engage in campaigning, and it shows when our people come together for larger-scale meetings. Nobody is in fear or suspicion, because everyone is totally genuine to begin with.

One of our aims in terms of leadership has always been to cultivate people with the right mentality into leaders, and when we had a selection of our Branch Leaders and prominent members to speak, it was apparent to both me and those gathered that they all had in common the pro-active mentality and the resilience that is sorely needed to actually bring political revolution to a head.

Following on from our conference, we have organised three further multi-branch meetings at which Branch Leaders and prominent members will also have the opportunity to speak and showcase what their Branches have done. These three meetings will be in West Yorkshire, the West Midlands, and Hampshire, providing opportunities for those up and down the country to get involved. Looking forward from there, the aim will be to hold a Spring conference of some description prior to the local election period next April.

Anyone interested in attending these meetings should contact the Party.

In the aftermath of our National Meeting, we are also able to announce the formation of two new Branches (one of which is already represented in this magazine), Portsmouth and Swindon, with leadership teams in place. By early next year we could well have Branches established in Liverpool and Leicester, with leaders already signalling their intent to step up.

It is absolutely vital that we offer as many people as possible the opportunity to get involved with our National Agenda and our vision of a genuine National Community, which is why branch activities must regularly campaign in areas where they can reach as many people as possible. Even though our Agenda is of equal value to rural areas, market towns and small villages, we must focus our campaigning where all of these people congregate, which is invariably in large population centres.

Concurrently to our political campaigning, some of our branches are increasing their community-based activities, by organising further charitable schemes or local initiatives designed to deal with local problems. You can read about some of these in the pieces from individual Branch Leaders. These kinds of activities will only escalate as the Party grows and the manpower and resources we have increase. This is the first step to setting people up as credible election candidates.

I encourage anyone who is a regular reader of this magazine who is not yet involved with the Party to try and come to one of our large-scale meetings or events, and officially join the party, so that together we might advance our National Agenda and its promise of true National Community. It is a road that requires work, resilience and sacrifice, but it is the only road to success.

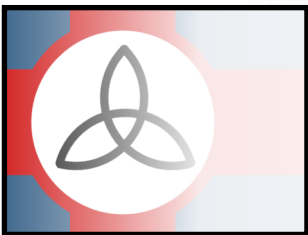

What's happening locally?

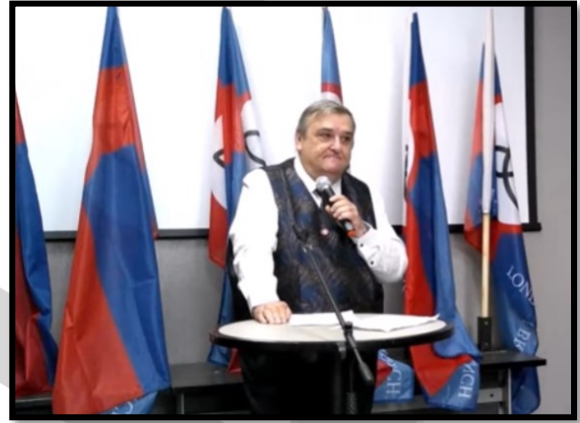
As usual I have been very busy in South Leeds with community work and getting involved and informed about various local projects going on. In addition to those reported about in previous editions (such as the food delivery scheme and the neighbourhood watch), I am working, along with a few others, on setting up a citizens advice centre in Beeston, which locals will be free to drop in if they want help with things such as dealing with the council, housing, job hunting and CV writing, or getting into education. There are a lot of people in South Leeds who lack good opportunities and who could really use a service like this.

Another project being worked on is called the Big Bike Fix. I did not create this project but am helping out with it where I can. The project aims to obtain and recondition bikes which can be given to children and young people. I have been working with a local councillor on this project, and by pooling resources with similar charities locally our aim is to generate more inventory and speed up the process of getting the bikes out. One of our supporters has kindly offered to donate a large number of bikes for this project.

There is an organisation in Holbeck called Leeds Wood Recycling, which aims to find a use for people's scrap wood, furniture etc. They have been able to successfully repurpose some, but if anyone around South Leeds has a use for any old wood, whether it is for wood fires or to use in any DIY joinery, on allotments etc, then they can have as much as they want for free.

ASHA in Leeds has just had its 40th anniversary this year as a charity. This charity is in the heart of Beston where I live and they have been doing brilliant work with women and families through the decades and now we are all looking forward to what the future holds. The main discussions were an increasingly insecure world and how charities can maximise their impact by nurturing community leadership and innovation. They offer advice and help to local residents, confidentially and impartially.

The Hunslet Club is another notable South Leeds organisation that has been going for generations. It offers a range of activities including physical sports activities, training and vocational activities, and youth workshops.

I've noticed that it's not just about elections and politicians and other things like the media - we desperately need to build power in our communities and trust for us to go forward into politics. When people connect, cooperate and speak up they are far better placed to hold institutions to account and influence decisions making. Getting involved in local activities rather than just being spectators speeds up the process of fixing local issues as well.

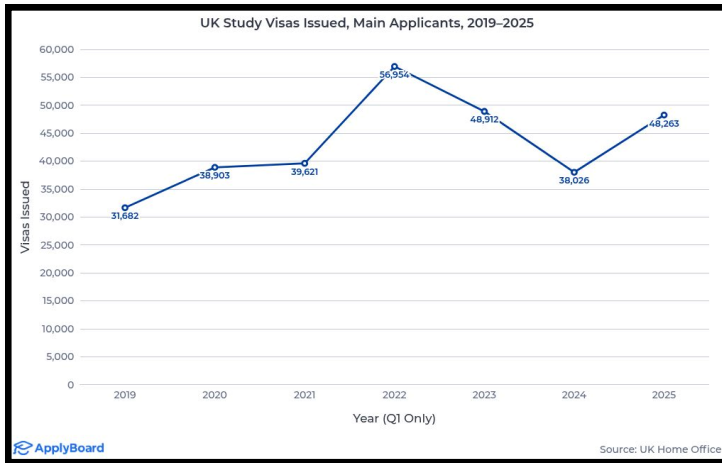
It also helps when you can work with community associations and residents committees. In Leeds one thing I have learned is that communication goes a long way. If you want to help improve the community speak face to face instead of relying on social media or emails. Everyone knows that residents face a broad range of issues including anti social behaviour, Parcel theft, licensing and events problems, also short term letting and building issues. I know more residents are looking to form a community association in the parts of Beeston that don't have one, and this can make a big impact and can solve problems amongst residents.

South Leeds as an area tends to be ignored by politicians - and many people who live there have totally disengaged from the political system because of it. There is a reason why it had the second-lowest turnout of any constituency in the last general election. Because of this, it has often lacked for good local services except those which the local people provide for themselves, which is why even if you don't hear about them or know about them immediately, if you go and look you can find all kinds of charity and community schemes provided by residents. In many ways it is an inspiration to other areas and an example that should be followed in this regard.

The Student visa system has produced insane numbers... a large proportion are given free reign to stay

What's happening Nationally?

The big issue on many people's minds apart from the state of the economy is immigration.

I recently conducted research into the government's student visa program, which as many people know has become a primary means of entry into Britain for immigrants. Just imagine if there was a way to emigrate from India to Britain with a 94% approval rate and a 74% chance of being allowed to stay until qualifying for indefinite leave to remain (effectively permanent). How many do you think would jump at the chance?

The student visa system has produced these insane numbers. A staggering 92,000 Indian nationals alone have so far taken advantage of this system, and at the current rate, in five years time, a further 69,000 Indians alone will have access to the NHS, universal credit, PIP and more. Every year our student visa system is open to people across the world, with approval rates of over 90% for countries such as Nigeria, Pakistan, Malaysia and Turkey. The numbers involved are ludicrous to the point where it has to be treated as malicious damage. And such a large proportion are given free rein to stay even after their studies are completed. No wonder the government is under criticism for telling lies about the scale of this problem - they deserve a lot more than criticism.

I have been monitoring wider immigration over the last month, including looking at the Home Office's own data. Statistics are as feared in the sense that there is little improvement and in some metrics they are even (cont'd)

worse than 12 months ago. In the last year 853,000 - a city larger than Leeds. Imagine the infrastructure needed to support a city as big as Leeds.

As usual, the services we already have will not be enough and either enormous money will have to be spent creating further services OR services will have to be stripped away from many of our own people.

In the last year 111,000 people claimed asylum, and the deals the government made with other countries to return the fraudulent claimants have produced scandalous (non)-results. The asylum housing is costing the taxpayer around £41,000 per year per person. More money is being sunk into this system than into newborn babies, and the National Rebirth Party is saying the same thing as virtually all of our people are saying now, which is that enough is enough, and this perpetual abuse of the British people and their resources must be brought to an end. The Party calls for the reorganisation of the citizenship and visa system to ensure that these mass-residency schemes are stopped, and in the rare circumstances where things such as student visas are permitted, there is no pathway to citizenship or permanent residency. Of course, all this has to be done hand in hand with reforms to our economy, society and political system, as we have to also move away from our reliance on foreign labour for our economy to function.

In summary, the Party must continue to balance local work and local campaigning with the context of national level problems. We have had some opportunities for growth of the Branch arise, and the plan is to get someone on board as my deputy organise, which will enable them to handle the campaigning side whilst I focus on the community projects and local work. Both things need to be done.

Towards the end of November, we have another meeting in West Yorkshire at which the Leeds branch and some of its members and supports will be present, and at this meeting I intend to talk through the work that our Branch has been doing as well as talk about goals for 2026.

From our Branches - HULL

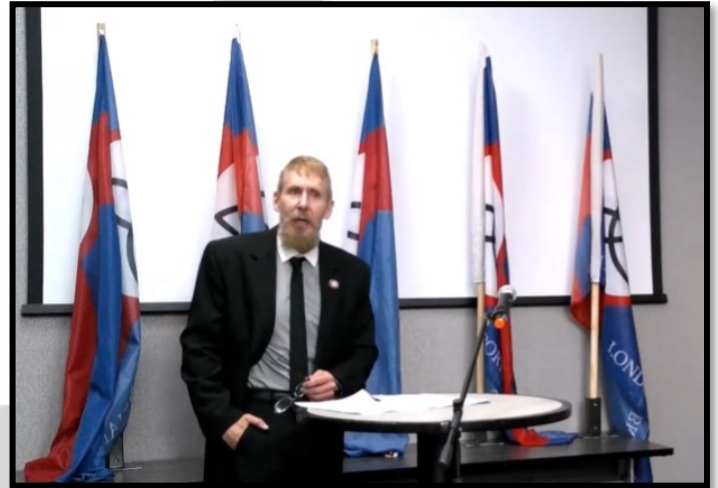
Firstly, on the National Meeting and Conference, I was really pleased with the venue and how accessible the event was. We were organised as a Hull unit beforehand so it made things very easy. It is also really good to see that off the back of the national meeting, we now have three multi-branch meetings in different parts of the country coming up before Christmas. The Hull unit will of course be represented at the Northern meeting in West Yorkshire.

Meeting up with other members and supporters from across the country was a great opportunity to put names to faces and work out methods of future collaboration. I encourage any of our members or supporters that haven't yet attended one of these meetings to get on board with the upcoming meetings or consider attending our next national meeting and conference.

I was impressed with the quality of the speeches from different Branch Leaders and party officials, including the Party Leader. They were captivating and informative. My own speech talked about an issue which has been central to Hull - the failure of Operation Marksman to have any meaningful impact on the grooming gangs or racial and religious crime in the city.

As for the Hull Branch, our Deputy Branch Leader Barry McGrath continues with his local community work including the community kitchen and repair café. These kinds of initiatives are a great way of helping people who otherwise slip under the radar. They also create a genuine sense of community and trust between neighbours - which is in the spirit of the National Community that we aim to create.

We have already held one of our monthly branch meetings in Hull city centre since the conference, and intend to hold another one towards the end of November. We have had a few new enquiries since the conference, so now we will work to get them on board officially. I make a few trips to Bridlington and other surrounding towns to Hull every now and then, often to see old comrades, and these are also opportunities to try and recruit new members. The Branch will also hold at least one day of action between now and the end of November, possibly the same day as our official Branch meeting, where we will engage in canvassing, paper sales and a street stall in Hull city centre. Op Marksman and its failure

As mentioned, this is an issue which rears its head in Hull repeatedly. For all the arrests and for an investigation that went on for years, nobody was charged. There is no doubt in anybody's mind that there were dozens, if not hundreds, of perpetrators, and it is absolutely scandalous that nothing came of it.

A significant reason why, and I talked about this at the conference, was the fact that the police and justice system were so scared of being called racist, that they did not want to acknowledge the racial and religious motive to the crimes. Better to cover it up to avoid 'community tensions'. This pattern has been the same in other places across Britain - Rochdale, Rotherham to name two.

Now there is a national inquiry into the grooming gangs, but there isn't much doubt that it will result in people being told what they already know, and nobody willing to say the difficult truths for fear of being called racist. The abuses will continue until we are prepared, as a nation, to accept that these crimes WERE religiously and racially motivated against white British girls.

The only solution to this can be what we propose in our National Agenda - a completely new law system with the end goal of removing the most horrific offenders from society, one way or the other.

From our Branches - LONDON

Going back to the beginning of September, it was a pleasure to attend the National Meeting and Conference. It felt amazing to connect with like minded individuals, it was professional at all times, and well organised. I think it's extremely important to have these kinds of conferences so communities inside and outside the party can feel reassured that change is coming, it's just a matter of time. I look forward to the upcoming cross-branch meetings, and intend to represent the London Branch at the Hampshire meeting in December.

The London Branch is continuing with its once-monthly stall and canvassing sessions. We have started venturing into central London more, as this enables us to talk to people from different London boroughs.

Major issues in London

Knife crime continues to be a major concern for people all across London.

The tragic deaths of the three young girls in Southport highlight the devastating impact of such violence and underscore the importance of ongoing efforts to address and reduce knife crime in society. Croydon (3,214) had the highest number of "violence with injuries" (ranging from actual bodily harm to life-threatening assaults) in year to June 2025, followed by Westminster (3,006), Lambeth (2,788), Newham 2,671), Brent 2,592, Greenwich (2,588), Lewisham (2,546), Southwark (2,532), Ealing (2,529) and Tower Hamlets (2,516). However, according to City Hall, the number of murders committed in the first nine months of 2025 was lower than any year since monthly homicide records began in 2003. Last year, London recorded the fewest killings of under-25s for more than two decades and the fewest of teenagers since 2012 .

It seems as though whilst the murder rate itself may be finally decreasing, the instances of serious violence are actually increasing. Much of this is related to gang violence. In terms of youth, a lot of the problem is driven by large numbers of young men who are abandoned by the system and are turning to crime and gang environments as their only source of respect and prospects. The solution to this isn't just in dealing with crime but also in giving people back these prospects of reliable work, decent homes, and access to education that their parents and grandparents had.

The other issue that repeatedly comes up is immigration. London's non-white population is already the largest of any European city at just under 2 million - 27 per cent of the capital's total. Demographers at the Greater London Authority predict that this will grow to a third within the next 10 years, thanks to immigration - most of the Britain's 185,000 new immigrants each year end up in the capital - and also higher birth rates among ethnic minorities. The birth rates among the white population across the whole of Europe is down 10 per cent over the last decade.

A shift to an overall non-white majority in London is a long way off, but it begins to look closer when you look at the city on a borough-by-borough basis. Brent has already reached majority non-white status, and other 'ethnic enclaves', as Powell called them, are growing in areas such as Southall and Tower Hamlets. John Hollis, demographer at the GLA, says: 'The biggest growth will be in London's Asian communities, which still have relatively large families, and also black Africans, due mainly to migration. It is also likely that the number of British-born children of Afro-Caribbean and mixed parentage will increase at a rapid rate. Future London may be defined less by interracial conflicts than by class. The ideal of a collective ethnic solidarity based solely on race, holds little truth in practice at present in London. Tomorrow's ethnic groups won't identify with people they relate to racially, but the ones whose lifestyles match their own.

Even with a non-white majority in the capital, black representation within its more conservative institutions will be harder to come by, particularly in the areas of housing, education, employment, politics and criminal justice. The ultimate takeaway from this is that if we actually want to fix the extreme fragmentation of a place like London, and work towards our ultimate goal of a homogenised (as much as possible) National Community, we have to recognise that at the moment, what we are working with in places like London is the complete opposite. And only hard work and offering people a genuinely better alternative will change that.

What was very obvious to me having attended the Conference - and it was the first time I got to meet many of the other Branches from other parts of the country - is that everyone is working for exactly the same agenda, and that we are all on the same page when it comes to trying to turn our agenda into reality. Everyone has the same vision for what the future can bring, even if some of the immediate issues in our Branch areas are different.

Each speech by the Branch Leaders wasn't just the usual, 'This is what we are *going* to do,' but instead the practical reality of our goals was discussed, tangible work was highlighted, and the focus was on how ideas can be made into practical results. The Branch Leaders also gave their opinions on various national-level topics, which were welcome additions.

The North-East will almost certainly be represented at the upcoming multi-branch meeting in West Yorkshire, and I have already discussed whether we could try and organise or host a meeting further towards Newcastle in the future, which might give an opportunity for any of our Scottish followers or members to come. Until then the local and campaigning work will continue.

From our Branches - NOTTINGHAM

The Nottingham Branch was represented at our first National Meeting and Conference, and has also been working hard to carry out campaigning activities around Nottingham and the East Midlands. Whilst we build our respective branches up, we have done some collaborative work with the Birmingham Branch across the Midlands, and we will be attending the cross-branch meeting in the West Midlands on the 15th November.

It was a pleasure to speak at the Conference about my political journey that brought me to the Party, and I hope that others can take some inspiration from it.

Given the changing political landscape in Britain, I think it is prudent to write on the following topic:

The rise and fall of the conservative party from 2010 to 2024

It seems only a short while ago we had a landslide victory for Boris Johnson as he swept to power in 2019 with the biggest majority since Margaret Thatcher's victory back in 1983.

The Conservatives had been in power since 2010 when David Cameron was elected and formed a coalition with the Liberals. However at the next election he won outright. He then dealt with the Scottish Independence vote and it seemed the Conservatives could do no wrong, however I believe the rot had already set in with the promise to appease some Tory MP's on having a referendum on leaving the EU.

This was indeed the beginning of the Conservative problem, they thought that obtaining minor concessions from the EU and using other world leaders most noticeably Barack Obama to tell us off for daring to want to leave they could overlook the will of the people. This proved costly as the vote did indeed go Leaves way and in what would be described as a huff Cameron promptly resigned without the thought of the country or the people leaving his party in the lurch. The Conservatives then used a Pro EU MP to become Prime Minister (Teresa May) to replace him, but obviously this would not work and everyone knew it, the will of the people was not acted on by the Conservative Government as everyone could see. The referendum result was being overlooked and the Conservatives did little to quell the anger of the people, of which the Leave voters were mainly conservative voters at the previous election so this was a serious problem, this (cont'd)

just seemed like a betrayal and the one person who picked up on this collapse of support for the Government was of course Nigel Farage, he had declared his work was done with UKIP but warned he would come back if Brexit was not acted on. This was a clear warning to the Conservatives.

At last in 2019 three years after the referendum result Boris Johnson took charge and famously quoted he will get Brexit done by calling a snap election, but three years on the government had dithered and Farage was on the attack, Johnson was able to appease Farage and he famously stood all Reform candidates down resulting in the huge win for Johnson. This really was a close shave for the Conservatives let off by Farage and with the fact Labour party was in an awful state with Jeremy Corbin as leader it could have been very different.

Sadly Johnson after the initial euphoria of the Brexit completion turned out to be a very poor prime minister, he struggled through the Pandemic with various mistakes and had the added pressure of a more polished opposite number in Kier Starmer snapping at his heels, but with such a huge majority in parliament he could have been able to make great strides this opportunity was wasted and after only three years he stood down as PM and party leader after being found guilty of breaching Covid regulations and a victim of infighting from his own party.

Just as it couldn't get any worse for the Conservatives they elected Liz Trust, a poor choice in all fields, her budget threw the City into chaos and clearly out of her depth she stepped down after only 50 days, making her the shortest serving PM in British history. (cont'd overleaf)

Really Labour never won the last election the Conservatives just lost it and to make things worse they helped create The Reform Party as their replacement. As we see now they are led by another weak leader that shows no sign of stopping the rot but only time will tell.

The state of British politics has changed drastically in this time with the emergence of real alternatives from the main two parties, people see that there is an opportunity for other parties to grow and gain support if they do the right thing. This can only be good news for us at the NRP.

East Midlands, although not just confined to Birmingham and Nottingham. We plan on doing Coventry, Rugby and other towns and cities.

I have high hopes for this initiative, in which we will build a solid partnership with Nottingham and all other Branches in the future. The Midlands will grow, as will elsewhere. On a more local level, we aim to put a few initiatives into action. At the moment these include litter picking, leafletting, and setting up a food bank.

At first, I must admit, I was a little bit dubious about the leafletting. I wondered whether this practice is still relevant in this day and age with the dominance of the Internet and social media. I discussed this NRP stalwart Luke Ward*, who told me he has regularly used this method of advertising, on numerous occasions and that it has worked wonders, so we're going with it. Great to see that old school ways are still relevant.

Onto the food bank, which is something I have high hopes for and which I know Dave Smaller (Deputy Leader/Leeds Chieftain) has successfully implemented in the Leeds area. We aim to follow on his footsteps. As with most things, we will have to learn to walk before we can run. The first task will be getting the food bank up and running. Long term goals include using locally grown produce, with the community actively involved, and to watch it grow, quite literally, organically.

With all these positive steps it's great to see how the National Rebirth Party is growing, striving, and continuously moving forward, especially in a world that can often at times, resemble a spinning asylum.

From there was when my previous liberal alignment passed on to me from my family and their friends, really started to go the other way. From having the entitlement of thinking I could be dependent on the state and others, to being totally independent, working and earning my own money to pay my way, gaining pride within myself. Self-proclaimed "morally superior" liberals I was raised around and associated with, but still maintained what at the time I thought were my beliefs of being liberal. But once these new blessings are settled, we will maintain to get back out there and show the public that we can, like myself, pull ourselves up by the bootstraps and reclaim this once great land.

It turned into a show of sorts, with celebrities flying in from different countries, merchandise being sold, songs being made. It became a grift. At one point there was a Spanish immigrant to America who was in Britain talking about immigration and religion, to a largely non-religious country. The hypocrisy was off the scales. It turned from something of pure intentions to something of greed, where people went to boost their online personalities and try to make a pretty penny off people's righteous anger.

After it was all done and the money had lined the pockets, the patriots who went to make a difference went home, and no change was made.

It boosted no political party, as it was organised by people from all sides, which meant that no party seen genuine growth from this, nobody was won over to the "nationalist" side as all those who attended were already on this side. Questions and Answers on Principles and Policy

Is the Party aware that the state pension is classified as taxable income now, and what is your view on this?

Yes, we are aware of this, and it is something that needs reforming in the pension system. It is unacceptable that the state pension counts as a form of taxable income. It should be treated as non-taxable in terms of counting towards thresholds. There are two reasons for this:

Firstly, because a person who has already been paying National Insurance contributions and income tax is effectively being taxed twice by being taxed on their state pension.

Secondly, because in principle it is wrong for the bare minimum state pension to face deductions. It is not a large amount of money and is intended to be there as an absolute minimum, and should not therefore be subject to further restriction, especially AFTER it has been paid out to the recipient in the form of demands for income tax.

The debate over the taxing of the state pension is part of a wider debate that needs to be had over the taxation of benefits and other welfare payments. Although the welfare system as a whole needs overhauling (which includes removal of frivolous payments and a transition from a system of giving money to people to instead giving productive work to people), people should in principle not be taxed on payments that are coming directly to them from HM treasury.

If they are earning so much income that they are over tax thresholds, the question has to be asked why they are receiving that much income from the state (there ARE some valid reasons). If a person is legitimately struggling then it is an extreme burden to be hit with a bill without expecting it, or being expected NOT to spend a portion of the money the state is giving them, just to hand it back in the form of income tax. The appropriate way of dealing with it is to just not give them the tax amount to begin with.

But as a general rule, people should not be getting taxed on money given to them by the government in the first place.

What is the solution to increasing birth rates in Britain to sustainable levels?

The main things which are contributing to low birth rates in Britain are as follows:

1. The Economic situation. Income relative to the cost of living is plummeting. Lack of disposable income incentivises people NOT to have children, or, if they have children already, NOT to have any more. The lack of readily available employment opportunities compounds the problem even further. The improvement of the economic situation and provision of more opportunities for stable housing and employment will naturally result in a higher birth rate.
2. Lack of optimism towards the future. This is a psychological phenomena, but if people perceive that by bringing children into the world, they will struggle to provide for those children, or that those children will have a worse quality of life than they do, they are less inclined to do it. This is why Britain requires a political programme centred around an optimistic vision for the future and a genuine National Community in which children can thrive.
3. The way that work/life culture is structured. Many young people are having to spend their 20s in tertiary education and other such pursuits that do not give them the time to raise a family. This is linked to the poor job market, which creates an escalating competition problem (that necessitates years of tertiary education to gain an advantage). The employment market is also unstable and does not offer enough reliable jobs in the same location, making it harder to set down roots and making factors such as schooling more difficult to plan for. Again, the solutions to this are economic and involve reshaping our economy away from services and more towards production.

It is a misconception that abortion and contraception are the main drivers of low birth rates. There are countries in the world where both of these things are virtually non-existent, yet the birth rates are lower than in Britain. They contribute slightly, but in numbers that are not significant to fixing the problem.

Questions and Answers on Principles and Policy

Do you think the BBC should be closed down?

The content of the BBC is routinely highlighted across the political spectrum as an issue. It is accused of being biased, infested with Marxist dogma, and of having abandoned its principle of providing genuine impartial content.

This is mostly true. There is a definitive bias within the institution that reflects the political and social views of its editors, staff and directors, and this bias is reflective of the views of the television industry as a whole. The liberal bias of the BBC is stimulated by a large degree of privilege in the upper echelons of decision-makers, who almost universally live in an idealistic world of abundance and wealth that is removed from the problems of normal folk. As such, they genuinely believe in ideas which most people, through lived experiences, can tell are bad.

But the principal of having a national broadcaster is a good one, and it is NOT a solution to this problem to just shut down the BBC. Every news provider is biased in some way, and thus closing down the BBC would not actually fix the problem. It would also eliminate the benefits of a public broadcaster. The view is taken that the BBC licence fee system should be scrapped, and the money spent to pay for the channel should instead be taken from standard government expenditure. This is the norm in most other countries that have a public broadcaster - tax money pays for it, not a specific utility bill.

To improve the quality of the programming on the network, and to address any bias issues, the Party proposes that having formed a government, the BBC should face much more active oversight from the relevant government ministry, with much more active scrutiny of its programming (effectively, signing off on the content) to ensure that it is factually accurate, not unjustifiably biased, and more reflective of the perceptions of the general population. The state in this instance would be perfectly placed to do this, being legitimately representative of those interests.

The BBC should also have its international programming capped. It should be making programming for the British public, not the world, especially given that it would be funded by the British taxpayer.

What is your attitude towards NATO?

NATO has existed since the end of the Second World War, and acted as a counterpart to the Soviet sphere for the remainder of the 20th century. In the present day, it has become a supranational military body principally focussed around Western European countries (and their former colonies/dominions).

There is great debate over whether NATO continues to serve a positive purpose as a defensive alliance, whether it actually causes the problems it claims to work to avoid, and whether it is in Britain's national interest to participate in NATO.

As with any discussion of foreign policy, it is vital to stress once again that countries are not the same as people. There are no 'friendly' countries or 'enemy' countries, there are just entities with their own interests, and whether they are your allies or enemies depends on whether those interests are favourable to your own, or hostile to your own.

At present, Britain is military dependent on NATO due to a hollowing out of its own military capabilities. It has effectively offshored military protection to the rest of the NATO body, particularly the United States. This is not desirable, because relying on a foreign power for our own national survival puts us in a permanent slave relationship with that power. Hence why our National Agenda contains provisions for a remilitarisation of our country to the point where such a relationship is no longer necessary.

The drawback of NATO is that it leaves the countries in it at the whims of the foreign policy of its leading powers, and compels us to arbitrarily assume a certain stance towards particular countries, regardless of any overriding national interest.

Whether membership of NATO is good or bad entirely depends on whether the wider interests of NATO at any given moment align with our national interests. However, there IS an inherent drawback to relying on a coalition for military protection instead of being capable of doing it ourselves. Therefore, the long-term goal must be to withdraw from these kinds of military alliances. Not because we are, or wish to be on, bad terms with the countries within it, but because the only path to autonomy in foreign policy is to have military self-reliance.





First Impressions of the First National Meeting and Conference

6th September, 2025

On the 6th September, the Party held its first National Meeting and Conference in Leeds. This was the first time that we brought together members and supporters, and officials from our active branches, to one place for an organised meeting. In total, 55 attended. Some were unable to due to distance, but eight of our nine active branches were present, and we had a lineup of genuine speakers from amongst the Party's leadership and membership. The speeches will slowly be made available on the Party's YouTube channel and website.

Our speakers for the day were:

1. **Branch Leader Leeds, David Smaller.** Who spoke about his experiences in political campaigning over the decades, why a new way was needed, and the constructive things he has been able to achieve in his constituency.

2. **Branch Leader Sunderland/Peterlee, Darren Houghton.** Who spoke about what brought him to the Party and the work that he has done, and intends to do, in the North-East.

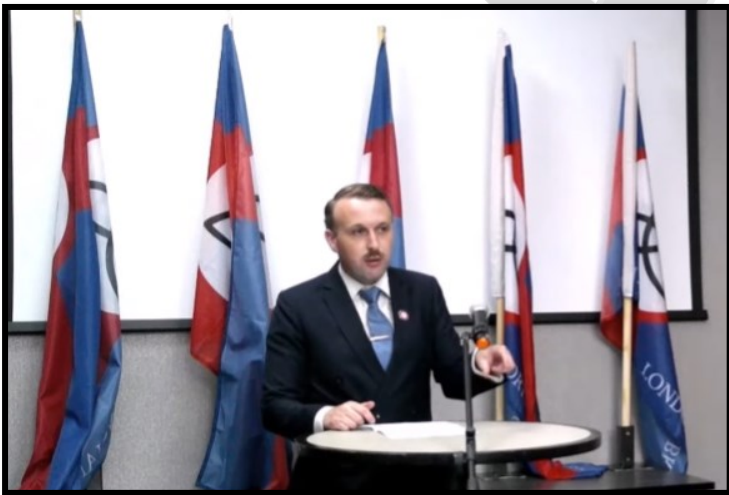

An attendee of our National Meeting and Conference from the United States shares his thoughts with Rise Britannia:

I liked the conference and it was good to meet people in person. I am a big fan of the speeches from 2023, so I was wondering if people would act and sound the same from what I could see on the Internet.

I got to meet Alek Yerbury and David Smaller and I had a few good long talks with Mr Smaller. And I am happy to report they act the same in person as I've seen on social media. I had a good long talk with Jonathan Mainprize as well, who I had never heard about. He was very welcoming to me and was enthusiastic in talking with me about my home state Alabama and my ancestors who fought for the Confederacy. He told me a story about a city in England that was very important to the Confederate blockade runners.

During the drink and snack break for the conference, I had some good conversations at the hotel bar. One gentleman struck up a conversation with me about Alabama. He brought up the book "Josey Wales" by Forrest Carter. That's the book the 1976 Clint Eastwood movie is based on. Forrest Carter's real name was Asa Carter and he was from Alabama. I guess he was a fan of that film, but as soon as he brought it up, I expressed great surprise. In case I had to wait a long time for the conference to begin, I brought a book with me to read that day. The book I had with me just so happened to be "Josey Wales" by Forrest Carter. After the conference was over, Alek Yerbury took a moment to talk to me and thank me for coming and I thanked him for organizing the National Rebirth Party and talking about "Our People". The Value of Organisation

Of all the qualities that made our people great, the greatest is the ability to organise. To create order out of chaos. To take an inundation of resources and people and arraign them in an efficient way. This quality is one which is supremely important in any political movement, because an organised force will always overcome a disorganised one, in the same way that a Roman legion fighting for each other would always overcome a mob of Celts predominantly fighting for themselves.

I know various people who attended the 'Unite the Kingdom' march on Saturday 13th. I did not, for reasons I have made clear in many forums, and I still would not attend any event organised or headlined by Stephen Lennon (AKA Tommy Robinson). I had a mixture of feedback, but then those people went for different reasons.

The real value in looking at that event is to assess it in terms of strengths and weaknesses especially in relation to the political 'left', or at least the political 'establishment'. When you do this, it becomes obvious that the strength is in the numbers that turn up, and the glaring weakness is in organisation of those numbers. To illustrate this I'll compare the standard organisation and operation of the 'left' and the 'right'.

The 'Left'

The political left are organised in a collectivised, hierarchical way. This is especially true of the activist left. They are organised in the same way that a military force is organised. The overall leaders pass instructions to sub-group leaders, who then disseminate those instructions to their own localised groups. Accounting for people is done at lower levels. For example, a Sheffield organiser will account for those in Sheffield and make arrangements for those people, and the ultimate organiser can simply deal with that ONE person instead of having to deal with everyone individually. Everything is organised around groups, and this saves enormous amounts of time and energy from being wasted. It is very easy to organise things like transport, protests, etc, without even having to resort to very generic 'call outs' on the public domain internet in the hope that people just turn up. The organisation makes people more reliable and makes communication a hundred times easier.

The 'Right'

The political right, by contrast, is overwhelmingly organised around individuals. There is a real culture of 'e-celebrity' and idolatry of individual people, and these people are the only lynchpin of communication that exists between the 'masses' of supporters. The compounding issue here is that these individuals often have little ability to organise. Organising events on the 'right' involves a high-profile person putting out some generic information, and then expecting random people to turn up. You can never be certain who will even appear until the day, if anyone. (cont'd overleaf)





The Value of Organisation

It is effectively left to the whims of every individual, whether they simply feel like doing something on that particular day. The main reason for this lack of organisation is because most people on the 'right' do not communicate with each other, or even attempt to. There could have been a thousand people from the same postcode who turned up to 'Unite the Kingdom' and at least 995 of them wouldn't have had any idea that was the case, either before or afterwards. They'd go home none the wiser.

Why is this important?

This contrast is important to highlight because organisation is the key to sustained and effective activity. 100,000 people turning up to one place for a few hours, then going home afterwards and doing nothing of political consequence, is politically impotent. If those people all went back to their own cities, towns, villages, and continued political activity in their own locality, along with all of the other people from that locality that went, every week, then it would have an enormous political impact. But that can only be done if people are organised and communicate with each other.

The 'left' at present constantly win, especially over a sustained period of time, because they have this ability to organise. Many people fuss over the way that they seem to perpetually 'bus in' hordes of activists, protestors and supporters on a weekly basis. This isn't because of money – the individual cost is very low – rather it is because they are much more organised. Someone can safely lay out £500 on a coach knowing that they have a list of fifty names who will almost certainly turn up and reimburse them. Someone on the 'right' at present cannot do this because the attendance is so dependent on whims that the chances are that 90% of those who said they will turn up, won't, and the person who laid the money out will end up out of pocket.

The biggest deficiency within the 'right' or within 'nationalism' is the lack of organisation, and this must be addressed in order to advance, because 100,000 people who are disorganised will always lose to 1,000 people who ARE organised. This is why we have this constant situation whereby no matter how many people on the 'right' turn up to something, it seems to make no political difference in the medium and long term. The lack of organisation and communication equals a lack of sustained activity which equals political impotence.

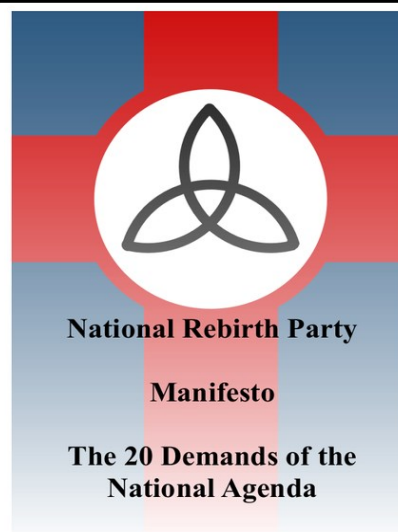

The Value of Organisation

How do we 'organise' the 'right'?

The first step, is to recognise that the existing 'activist right' – things like Unite the Kingdom – is inherently and pathologically disorganised, and stop attempting to organise that entire faction on its own. There is no conceivable way that one person or even a small group of people can go into an anarchic, chaotic, leaderless crowd of 100,000 people and somehow control it. I do not believe there is even the ability to recruit people at events like that, because the majority of people there do not actually want to be organised.

Once you are prepared to write off this faction of politics, then the real work can begin of looking for people who do in fact want to be organised and in numbers that you can actually control. Instead of seeking out the largest and most chaotic crowds, look for smaller ones where the ability to co-ordinate people or small groups of people is greater. Find semi-organised groups that exist at a smaller scale, for example local residents' associations, community groups, protest groups, etc. These are much more workable than festival style events where the numbers are in six figures but the reasons people have for attending are so random that nothing can be done with them.

At a Party level, and we have already started the process of doing this, leadership at a Branch and Regional level must be given the information they need to effectively co-ordinate people, and we must start emulating the organisational strategy of the left, where the ultimate decision makers are not having to individually communicate with and account for every single individual person. Party Leaders cannot function as secretaries communicating between individual members or sub-unit leaders, passing messages back and forth. Those people **MUST** communicate with each other. (cont'd)

At the same time, the culture of idolatry of individuals and 'celebrity' must be worked against, because it is a complete hindrance to any political cause. Political action must be organised around ideals and movements, NOT around individual people. If the way that the 'left' organises yields them better results, especially in the medium and long-term, then instead of denigrating those methods, copy them.

Featherstone Town Council Meeting - 8th October, 2025

One of our members, Mark Barnes, takes an active role in engaging with his local authority and local groups organised in response to community issues. In this 'review' he has written of his activities, we can see why it is important for our people to engage with the institutions of power, and how only by doing this we can hope to take control of those institutions.

On 8th October 2025, another gentleman and I attended the monthly public meeting of Featherstone Town Council.

Proceedings opened with a touching tribute to the late Graham Isherwood, after whom the Council Chamber has now been officially renamed The Graham Isherwood Suite.

This was a relatively short meeting, lasting just over 30 minutes, but it proved to be both important and positive from the perspective of Migrant Watch (a local group that I work with, which was formed because of the issues created by migrant hotels in the Five Towns area).

Refusal of HMO Planning Permission

We are very pleased to report that planning permission for the proposed HMO at 183 Pontefract Road has been refused, meaning that a new HMO in Featherstone will not be going ahead. This represents a significant local victory.

During the meeting, Councillor Vickers made a short statement to the Council and to me personally regarding what he viewed as inaccurate and unfair reporting in my submission of the Migrant Watch minutes in September. In that report, I had stated that the Council was acting under pressure from Migrant Watch.

Councillor Vickers wished to make clear that his longstanding and well-documented opposition to HMOs predates Migrant Watch's formation and early activity. This point was noted. Additionally, it was reported that Councillor Maureen Tennant-King had contacted local newspapers — including the Wakefield Express and the Pontefract and Castleford Express — to address inaccuracies in their reporting of the Council's business regarding HMOs. It is important to record these clarifications in the interests of fairness and balance. Nonetheless, regardless of the specific reasons behind the refusal, we are delighted with this outcome.

Community Flagpole and Beacon Initiatives

The Council unanimously supported a proposal to erect a flagpole in the town to fly the flag on notable occasions such as VE and VJ Day. Councillor Vickers voiced his frustration with what he described as the “intransigent” and “preposterous” bureaucratic rubric imposed by Wakefield Council, which he believes is unnecessarily delaying progress. He expressed his personal desire to move forward more swiftly.

In addition, plans for the installation of a beacon to commemorate significant events are well advanced. Subject to health and safety assessments and the necessary planning permissions, it is hoped that the beacon may be operational in time for Remembrance Sunday 2025.

Community Funding

Councillor Vickers also reminded the meeting that Featherstone and Lupset are set to receive £2 million of public funding for community projects.

It remains to be seen how this funding will be allocated and what constitutes a “community project”, which will undoubtedly be an area for public interest, accountability, and scrutiny in the months ahead.

Opening Prayer

Father Joseph was absent from this month's meeting. Councillor Vickers made a special request to deliver a prayer before the main business commenced. This was a respectful and dignified gesture, helping to elevate proceedings and frame them within a shared cultural context.

Summary

These may seem to be small steps but, if repeated in council chambers up and down the country and ultimately at the ballot box for radical parties outside the establishment paradigm, the harbinger of national change and renewal.





The Politics of Obedience

'The Discourse of Voluntary Servitude' by Etienne de La Boetie

The Discourse of Voluntary Servitude' by Etienne de La Boetie (pronounced Bwa-tee) was an essay published clandestinely in 1577.

Etienne de La Boetie, November 1st, 1530-August 18th, 1563, was a French magistrate, classicist, writer, poet, and political theorist.

In his essay, written in the Middle French language, La Boetie delves into the problem of civil obedience, which was an issue which greatly concerned him. In the essay, he examines the acquiescence of submissiveness from the masses to a small minority of the population, ie; the Government.

La Boetie feared the consequences of blindly following those in authority and the path which it could essentially lead to. Tyranny, totalitarianism, and oppression. That was La Boetie's reason for writing 'The Discourse of Voluntary Servitude'.

Although written in the 16th Century, which is something you must always bear in mind whilst reading it, it did have a great effect on me. Whereas La Boetie's fear was of oppression from his OWN Government, which I relate to, in today's world it extends beyond borders to a powerful Elite and its Globalist Agenda. 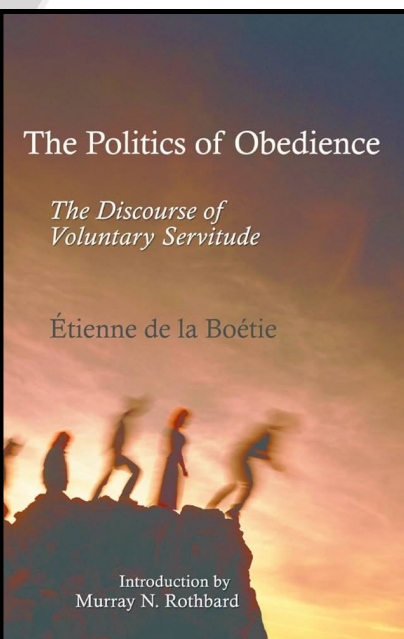

The Flight from Diversity

We could hear them above us cursing and flinging all our possessions across the room.

We hardly dared breathe, desperate to not give away our basement location and clutching each other as if our lives depended on it.

I tried to appear strong and in control of my fear, and from the looks of my wife and two children with their resolute expressions, I felt reassured. Five minutes later, which felt like forever, the noises and voices ceased, and the tension slowly evaporated. My brave wife of some twenty years comforted our early teenage children, and I managed to brew up a pot of tea using a small camping gas stove as the electrical supply to the house had been severed by the unholy alliance of Muslims, blacks and Indians which had taken control of this once proud island.

My brain was working overtime as I realised our hiding place would eventually be discovered even though I had cleverly disguised the trapdoor entrance to our underground lair. Our supplies were running low and none of us had had a good night's sleep or wash for a week.

Also, the stench was overpowering despite the camping disinfectant loo, which I had rigged up before we were forced to retreat to the basement, after we had seen the gangs working their way down our street and smashing open locked house doors.

We needed to leave the house and quick, that was clear as day, and it would have to be under cover of darkness.

I'd had a text from an old work colleague a few days back telling me that his own and another family that I knew had headed over to a remote farm in south Wales and would welcome us if only we could find a means of getting there. I knew that our car had been vandalised beyond repair by the marauding mobs, so that means of escape was not open to us. I texted my friend that we would love to join him but for the moment had no means of getting there.

Realising that the safest time to leave our hidey hole would be well after dark I told the wife and kids to try to get some shut eye during the daytime. About 9pm I raised the trapdoor, and we all emerged into our pitch-black garage. As quiet as mice we left through a creaky side door and hesitantly moved towards the pavement.

I noticed the children looked terrified and were gripping tightly to each hand of my stoical wife.

I'd lived in the area most of my adult life and knew all the nooks and crannies. We edged along the pavement until we reached a very narrow alley which led towards the town centre. I could smell smoke and as we reached the end of the alley, we could see that the local church was well ablaze, and the roof had partly collapsed. The smoke became quite thick, and we could hear some cries of 'Allah Akhbar' which seemed disconcertingly close. The smoke was a stroke of luck for us as I got the family to use it as a visual barrier between us and the foreigners who seemed to be celebrating the destruction of another symbol of our Christian heritage.

The railway station was nearby, and my pulse raced when we could finally glimpse the entrance. My friend in Wales had told me that the rail service was one of the few pieces of UK infrastructure which were still operating to a reasonable level, and as we set foot on the platform (the barriers were open) I could barely refrain from whooping for joy.

I could read on the digital display that a train to Cardiff would arrive in twenty minutes, and reassured the kids that things were going to plan and to stay calm and strong.

My mind was racing, and I found myself squeezing my wife's hand so tightly that she winced in pain. I was praying that we wouldn't be approached by a station official, but our luck ran out when my son spotted a dark figure approaching along the platform. It was too late to duck out of the way into the waiting room, or the toilet block, so in preparation for just such a moment I reached inside my jacket inside pocket for my bundle of ten-pound notes. In broken English the station attendant asked to see our tickets. I replied as calmly as I could, while wondering whether he may be armed as I had heard on the grapevine that firearms were being openly displayed, and sometimes being used. I told him the ticket machine was not working and that I had been unable to book in advance using my phone. (cont'd overleaf)

But my bribe had worked and in a couple of minutes we were sitting in an empty carriage heading to Cardiff. About 30 minutes in we had another major scare when an Indian ticket inspector came very quietly into our still empty carriage. I hadn't expected out tickets to be checked on such a late evening journey, so I hastily repeated my bribery tactic. I offered him some fifty pounds, but this guy was greedy and indicated by rubbing his fingers together that he required more to ensure his silence. I guess I had to part with about a hundred and fifty quid before he was satisfied. He appeared to be carrying some sort of curved blade under his uniform which resembled pictures of kukris that I had seen.

But our luck was holding out, but for how much longer? The wad on notes in my pocket had become very thin, and we had nothing else of value apart from our watches and wedding rings. The train screeched into Cardiff station just gone midnight and we waited a minute or so until the other passengers had exited before we all crept cautiously from the train hardly daring to enter the large station concourse.

My friend had not let me down and sure enough a red 4 x 4 was waiting for us right at the back of the car park. Physically and mentally exhausted we all threw ourselves into the back and I let go an expletive that I had managed to restrain until this moment of catharsis. We sped off at a gallop until we left the outskirts of the city and started winding our way along some very minor roads to ensure we would not be easily detected or stopped at a random roadblock that were set up to trap fleeing people.

And so, our broken family deserted our beloved house and town for the unknown with just a few changes of clothing and minimal toiletries. 'White flight' was not proving to be an easy road but at least we now had some hope and company of our own people.

Arming the Revolt: Essential Readings for the Western Nationalist

The latest chaos erupting in the digital cesspool of online nationalism - where "ethnats" and "civnats" clash in futile flame wars, and some frankly clueless pretenders dare to claim our sacred fire - has driven me to ask the question: what is the true essence of our creed? We stand not for the hollow liberal nationalism of the post-Napoleonic 19th century. We wage a radical transvaluation of all values, rooted in the blood and soil of our authentic Being!

Having said that, the average reader of *Rise Britannia* is a lot more intelligent and perceptive than the average university-spawned NPC or liberal commentariat drone. Knowledge and learning the key to our worldview, with the unyielding truth of our heritage arming us against all doubters! The typical university-educated liberal can't last fifteen minutes in debate with a self-educated nationalist, but reverts to type and throws a tantrum, hurling the same tired old insults - "bigot," "extremist," "divisive," - in an attempt to expiate the feebleness of their arguments.

This being the case, I thought it a worthwhile endeavour to compile a list of texts by authors that the reigning power-elites don't want you to know about, because they threaten the architecture of their precious, "inclusive," globalist fairytale at its foundations. These books arm the mind and spirit to shatter the liberal illusion and reclaim our sovereign destiny. Dive in, comrades; the hour demands it!

Oswald Spengler - *The Decline of the West* (1923)

The most influential work to emerge from the German Conservative Revolution, the Weimar-era intellectual movement that laid the foundations for National Socialism (though some of its leading exponents were later to become critics of the NSDAP and Third Reich). *Decline of the West* expounds Spengler's theory of civilizational lifecycles, which every thinking Western nationalist should be familiar with. First published in one volume in 1923, anyone who doesn't have the time or patience to read the unabridged version - which runs to half a million words - should get the Werner/Helps edition, which does a masterful job of condensing it to just over 400 pages. On the other hand, anyone who develops an insatiable taste for Spengler should also check out his other works - the much shorter *Man and Technics*, the essay "Prussianism and Socialism" (which is also essential for understanding Francis Parker Yockey's ideas), and his final book, *The Hour of Decision*, which in 1934 predicted the global non-white population explosion. 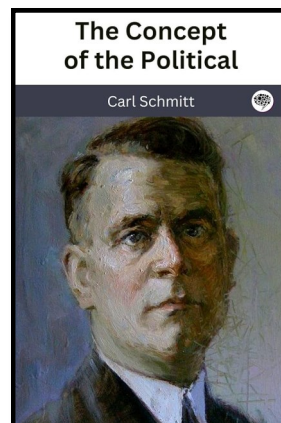
Carl Schmitt - *The Concept of the Political* (1932)

Probably the most important thinker of the Conservative Revolution after Spengler, Schmitt was the Third Reich's top legal expert, for which the victors of the Second World War never forgave him. In *The Concept of the Political*, he puts the sword to liberal dreams of universal harmony, demonstrating how democracy as a concept can only be valid when applied to an ethnically homogeneous population, and how a dictatorial regime that has the mandate of the people is more democratic than a parliamentary one that lacks it. Anyone who finds insight in Schmitt's short book should also check out his *Political Theology*, plus his postwar works, *Theory of the Partisan* and the geopolitical masterpiece, *Nomos of the Earth*.

Oswald Mosley - *The Alternative* (1947)

I imagine all readers of *Rise Britannia* will have at least a passing familiarity with this man and his career! Published two years after Mosley's release from house arrest in 1945, *The Alternative* demands a united Europe - not the liberal vision of today's European Union, but a self-sufficient civilizational bloc, free from the subversions of international finance, with a common foreign, defence, and economic policy - as a counter-power to the United States and Soviet Union, the two superpowers that had occupied and partitioned Europe at the end of the Second World War. OM considered *The Alternative*, which became the guiding text of his postwar Union Movement, to be his magnum opus. His writings from the British Union of Fascists era - *The Greater Britain*, *Tomorrow We Live*, *Fascism: 100 Questions* - are well worth your time, too. (cont'd overleaf)

Arming the Revolt: Essential Readings for the Western Nationalist

Francis Parker Yockey - *Imperium* (1948)

My favourite political book since I first read it some time around 2002. *Imperium* gives a practical application to the works of Spengler and Schmitt, and encompasses all the developments in Western nationalist thought since 1945. Yockey, an American sympathizer of the Axis Powers, after the war succeeded (incredibly!) in joining the Nuremberg tribunal's prosecution staff, with the aim of helping the defendants. After many continent-crossing adventures, he ended up dying in suspicious circumstances in FBI custody in 1960 - officially a suicide, though many have speculated otherwise. I recommend the Noontide Press edition if you can find a copy, though the Invictus Books one is quite adequate and handy for readers on a budget. The Wermod & Wermod edition, while beautifully presented with extensive footnotes and appendices, checks in at 926 pages, which is frankly unwieldy for comfortable reading. Yockey's pendant work to *Imperium*, *The Enemy of Europe*, is also essential, and was published by Liberty Bell Publications in a single volume with American white nationalist professor Revilo P. Oliver's critique and tribute, *The Enemy of our Enemies*, which is out of print, but should be easy enough to track down.

A.K. Chesterton - *The New Unhappy Lords* (1967)

This book, with its strong emphasis on the British Empire, will inevitably appear very dated, especially in comparison with the pan-European outlook of most of the authors included here. However, its exposition of how apparently opposing world powers collude behind the scenes to serve the same global financial agenda appears extremely prescient in the light of such events as the COVID lockdowns and the Russia-Ukraine War. Chesterton began his political career with Mosley in the BUF during the 1930s, and after the war returned to political activism with the League of Empire Loyalists. In 1967, the year this book was published, he became the first chairman of the National Front.

Julius Evola - *Revolt Against the Modern World* (1934, rev. ed. 1969)

While I disagree with many of Evola's metaphysical concepts and over-reliance on a conspiratorial model of history, his argumentation for a Primordial Tradition - and its antithesis - is of an intellectual character to rank it among the other classic works I've mentioned. His subsequent work *Men Among the Ruins* (1953, rev. ed. 1972) also bears a mention - this book is far more political, and (cont'd)

provides the groundwork for a European Imperium, comparable to the Mosley and Yockey books listed above. However, anyone not already familiar with both Evola's philosophy and the political history of Italy risks getting pretty lost in it.

Maurice Bardèche - *Nuremberg, Or the Promised Land* (1948)

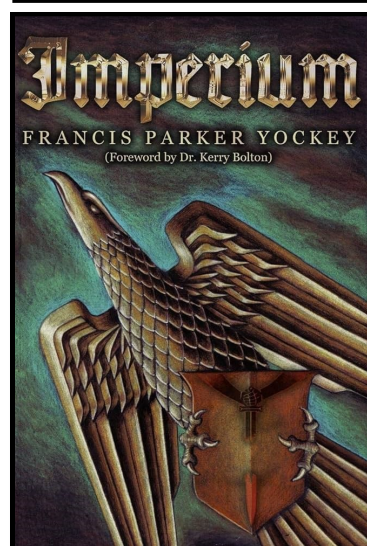
A brief but devastatingly prophetic work by France's leading nationalist philosopher of the postwar years, arguing that the Nuremberg Trials represented the codification of a new global morality that would lead to multiculturalism, open borders, and mass non-white immigration being forced upon the West.

Rolf Gardiner - *Water Springing From the Ground* (1972)

This one is out of print and very rare, but any eco-conscious British or English nationalist will surely want to seek out a copy! Rolf Gardiner was the father of "blood and soil" English nationalism and a pioneer of the revival of folk traditions, such as Morris and sword dancing. This book is a "best of" anthology of his essays on rural revival, organic farming, and cultural renewal.

Friedrich List - *The National System of Political Economy* (1841)

The OG manual for economic nationalism. List demands for protective tariffs and state-driven industry to build a self-sufficient nation, shielding the people from globalist exploitation. Couldn't be more timely in the post-Brexit era. (cont'd overleaf)

Arming the Revolt: Essential Readings for the Western Nationalist

Georges Sorel - *Reflections on Violence* (1908)

The classic revolutionary syndicalist work, championing the myth of heroic struggle to awaken the masses and overthrow decadent elites. A key inspiration for 20th century revolutionary leaders from Mussolini to Lenin. Handle with care.

Werner Sombart - *The Jews and Modern Capitalism* (1911)

A provocative analysis arguing that Jewish traders, excluded from medieval guilds, shaped modern capitalism's anti-traditional spirit, sparking social upheaval. Attacked by völkisch radicals of the era as too conciliatory, it remains a bold critique of globalist economics.

Jude Wanniski - *The Way the World Works* (1978)

Something of an outlier here: Wanniski was a supply-side economist who was on Ronald Reagan's advisory panel. Apart from just being a good book on economics, his work is useful for how its observations on voter dynamics inform strategies to gain electoral traction.

Richard Thurlow - *Fascism in Britain: A History, 1918-1985* (1987)

A hostile and rather dry account, but surprisingly objective on the Mosley movement, if less so on its other subjects.

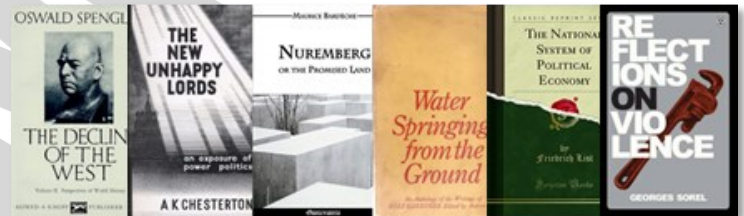
Martin A. Lee - *The Beast Reawakens: Fascism's Resurgence from Hitler's Spymasters to Today's Neo-Nazi Groups and Right-Wing Extremists* (1997)

An objectively dreadful book by an antifascist hack, but useful for its accounts of Yockey and other key figures. It was actually one of my key sources of information in the days before you could find everything online.

John Bean - *Many Shades of Black: Inside Britain's Far Right* (1999)

The riveting and very witty autobiography of a veteran British nationalist who passed away a few years ago at the age of 94, after a lifetime of dedicated service to the Cause.

That's your battle plan for now! Armed with this intellectual and ethical firepower, you're unstoppable! Many of these works can be found free online in various formats, or if you're like me and crave the weight of a physical book, sites like [Advanced Book Exchange \(www.abebooks.co.uk\)](http://www.abebooks.co.uk) are invaluable for hunting them down. The Twenty Demands of the Nationalist Agenda

1. We demand that only people of British heritage or lineage shall be inherently entitled by birth to be British citizens.
2. We demand that foreigners whose presence is harmful to the interests of the national community be expelled, without exception, from Great Britain. Those who enter without permission shall be expelled by default and prohibited from ever returning.
3. We demand that only British citizens be permitted to vote or hold public office at any level.
4. We demand that no foreign treaty, alliance or undertaking be entered into or continued unless it serves the interests of the national community. This includes the distribution of British money to foreign nations.
5. We demand that all citizens will have equal rights, and equal duties to society. Those who refuse to carry out their duties will be stripped of their rights.
6. We demand that every British citizen has a duty to be productive, to the best of their ability. All honest work is honourable, and work is a duty.
7. We demand that all British men must perform some kind of military service for a period of at least 18 months, to the best of their ability.
8. We demand a justice system with the end goal of removing the most dangerous offenders from society. The most serious crimes, including crimes against the nation and its people, must carry the death penalty.
9. We demand the creation of a new British Law System whereby the first principle of the system is accessibility.
10. We demand freedom of religion for all British people, so long as the religion does not threaten or harm the interests of the national community. Any religion which does this shall be prohibited.
11. We demand the continuation of state-funded education. We further demand that the state should establish and finance a series of schools of excellence, which will provide scholarship education of the highest possible quality, free of charge, with admittance purely on the basis of academic merit.
12. We demand that British citizens shall continue to have access to a state-funded National Health Service, and the state should routinely promote and fund programmes which encourage a physically and mentally healthy lifestyle. Foreigners or visitors will be required to pay for the use of public health services.
13. We demand that the re-zoning of green land for other uses must only occur by absolute national necessity. Policies to protect the environment must be realistic and achievable and not based on impossible goals.
14. We demand that productive private enterprise be bolstered as a cornerstone of British society. Businesses should be encouraged to form co-operatives and collaborate where possible for mutual benefit. The state must support businesses which work towards national economic goals.
15. We demand that all trade unions be amalgamated and the national government assume the duty of the protection of the worker.
16. We demand that all public utilities and transportation networks be placed into public ownership. The only profits they will take will be those required for future investment.
17. We demand that the financial method of endlessly accumulating debt be brought to an end, and that the two principle objectives of fiscal policy be to 1) eliminate debt, and 2) prevent inflation.
18. We demand that tariffs be applied where necessary to protect and foster the development of British enterprises. International capitalism, and its relentless destruction of British industries, must be ended.
19. We demand a welfare system that provides unemployed or destitute persons productive employment as opposed to a dependency income. The welfare system must also include profit margin limitations on rents and property prices.
20. We demand that the British state be controlled by a strong national government, with total authority, whose legitimacy derives directly from the consent of the British citizenry by way of plebiscites and referenda of public approval.
